

Monday (Mar.24 th)	<p>Scripture: Mark 14:43 – 52</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> If <i>you were one of the disciples</i> witnessing the situation, how would <i>you feel/react when you see how Judas treated Jesus</i>¹? Vs. 43-46 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Would <i>you have done what Peter did</i> (John 18:10)? Why/why not? Vs. 47 How did Mark describe the <i>reactions of the disciples/those present</i>? Vs. 48-50 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Reflect on this question: Throughout your faith journey, has there been a <i>moment where you deserted Jesus/did not treat him faithfully because of peer pressure or in situation where you find it difficult to acknowledge Him</i>?
Tuesday (Mar.25 th)	<p>Scripture: Mark 14:53 – 65</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> What was <i>Peter doing</i> while Jesus was with the whole Sanhedrin? Vs. 53-54 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Why do you think <i>Mark emphasized twice that the false testimony about Jesus did not agree</i> (Deu.19: 15-19)? What is the significance? Vs. 55-59 What <i>reminder and encouragement</i> does it give you when Jesus claimed He is the “<i>I am</i>”? Vs. 61b-62 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Reflectively meditate on this question: <i>For whom did Jesus take the torture, the rejection, and the condemnation for and why would He do so?</i> How would you respond to Jesus? Vs. 63-65
Wednesday (Mar.26 th)	<p>Scripture: Mark 14:66 – 72</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> What <i>wording</i> did Peter use to respond to the girl? Vs. 66-71 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> What do you think is <i>wrong with Peter’s last response in verse 71</i>? If <i>you were Peter</i>, would you have <i>reacted the same</i>? Why/why not? What do you think would be the <i>hardest feeling for both Jesus and Peter at that moment</i>, especially after the rooster crowed the second time? Vs 72 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> According to Mark’s description of Peter’s reaction, “<i>And he broke down and wept</i>”, what can you <i>learn from Peter’s repentance</i>?
Thursday (Mar.27 th)	<p>Scripture: Mark 15:1 – 15</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Based on <i>what concrete evidence</i> did the chief priests, the elders, the teachers of the law, and the whole Sanhedrin <i>make their decision on Jesus’ crucifixion</i>? How does their <i>decision make you feel</i>? Vs.1 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Why do you think <i>Pilate was amazed at Jesus’ silence/no reply</i>? Vs. 3-4 How does the <i>accusation of Jesus and the release of Barabbas shadow today’s society</i>? What <i>similarities</i> do you see happening in the world today? Vs. 6-15 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Meditate on Isaiah 53:3-6: <i>He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows, and familiar with suffering. Like one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not. Surely he took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, yet we considered him stricken by God, smitten by him, and afflicted. But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed. We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all.</i>

Friday (Mar.28 th)	<p>Scripture: Mark 15:16 – 32</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> What did the <i>soldiers put on Jesus to humiliate him as king of the Jews</i>? Vs. 16-18 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <i>Jesus was passive and silent</i> throughout their acts, why? How did Mark describe how the <i>soldiers mocked Jesus</i>? Vs. 19-20 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Reflect on all the <i>worse moments/situations in your life and compared them to what Jesus experienced for you</i>. What does this tell you? Knowing that Jesus suffered for you, what must you <i>improve and or breakthrough in your spiritual condition to become a more active Christian</i>?
Saturday (Mar.29 th)	<p>Scripture: Mark 15:33 – 41</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Specifically <i>describe how Jesus was treated at the last hour of his crucifixion</i> by the soldiers, the people, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and those crucified with him? Vs. 23-32 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> What does <i>Jesus’ silence</i> throughout his crucifixion <i>tell us about him</i>? According to this challenge of the chief priests and the teachers of the law toward Jesus: “<i>Let this Christ, this King of Israel, come down now from the cross, that we may see and believe</i>”, what does it teach us about <i>true faith</i>? Vs. 32 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> How <i>true is your faith in Christ</i>? How do you <i>live your daily Christian life to show such faith</i>?
Sunday (Mar.30 th)	<p>Scripture: Psalms 44</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> How did the <i>Psalmist praise the LORD</i> for past victories/how did their ancestors won over the enemies? Vs. 1-8 How did the <i>LORD treat Israel’s present situation</i>? Vs. 9-16 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Why do you think the <i>Israelites had to face such consequences</i>? What do these <i>consequences teach us about our relationship with God</i>? How did the Psalmist describe <i>Israel’s plea to the LORD for help</i>? Vs. 17-26 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> What it is in <i>your life now that you plea the LORD to help you</i>? Meditate on Psalm 103:8 – “<i>The LORD is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in love</i>”.

¹Judas was with the disciples throughout Jesus’ ministry. They worked, ate, traveled and lived together. Now, this friend and co-worker brought a crowd to arrest Jesus, their master.
