Vs.1 – 4 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What gives you the greatest joy in your ministry/life? Why? 2. How did John teach us to treat each other in the LORD, even though he/she may be stranger to us? Why? Vs. 5 – 8 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What do you do on a regular basis to show God’s servants you support them in their ministries for the LORD? 3. What are the three examples of divine judgment? Vs. 5 – 7 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • According to the three examples of divine judgment, what does God not want us to do or what does he hate?

Why would Jude use the way of Cain, Balaam’s error, and Korah’s rebellion as examples to warn us that judgment is coming? Vs. 11 – 13 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What metaphors did Jude use to describe the false teachers? Vs. 12 – 13 • At Christ’s second coming, how did Jude describe who he will judge and convict? Vs. 15 – 16 3. How does this passage help you to stand firm in your faith and to be better alert during the end times?
Thursday (Apr.10 th)	<p>Scripture: Jude 17 – 21</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What happens in the last times and what kind of people would divide the believers? Vs. 18 – 19 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Why is the “Spirit” extremely important to one’s salvation? • What do you think it means to live in the “Spirit”? 2. What 3 things did Jude encourage us to do to persevere in our faith? Vs.20 – 21 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What do you think life would be like for a Christian who continuously builds himself/herself up in the most Holy faith, prays in the Holy Spirit, and keeps himself/herself in God’s love? • Do you live such a wonderful Spirit-led life? Why/why not?
Friday (Apr.11 th)	<p>Scripture: Jude 22 – 25</p>

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How did Jude teach us to show mercy and save those from the verge of destruction? Vs. 22 – 23. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What do you think it means by “hating even the clothing stained by corrupted flesh”? • Why do you think Jude warns us to be very careful and alert when helping others? 2. What encouragement, comfort, and guarantee of God can you find in the doxology? Vs. 24 – 25 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Why do you think the doxology is so important to the Christians? That is, why do you think the Reverend needs to give us the benediction at the close of the worship service each week?
Saturday (Apr.12 th)	<p>Scripture: Genesis 1:1 – 2:3</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Of all the creative things in the first 5 days, why do you think God created light first? Vs. 1 – 5 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What is the climax of God’s creative activity? Vs. 26 – 27 • How was God’s creative activity in the 6th day differed from the first 5 days? Vs. 1 – 31 2. What is God’s first commission to humanity after they were created? Vs. 28 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What impact does God’s first commission have on you? Why? • How serious do you take the Sabbath¹? Why/why not?
Sunday (Apr.13 th)	<p>Scripture: Psalms 46</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How can you tell the Psalmist fearlessly trust in God? Vs. 1 – 3 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How do you show you trust in God on a daily basis? 2. How did the Psalmist describe God’s mighty power/triumphant? Vs. 4 – 10 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Why do you think God suddenly spoke up to the nations saying, “Be still, and know that I am God”? Vs. 10 • Are you able to be still and wait upon God on a regular basis or are you often in a rush? How so? • What advantages do you think a Christian would have if he/she is often “Be still and know He is God”?
