

Monday (Apr. 14 th)	<p>Scripture: Genesis 2:4 – 25</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> At what point did the <i>man become a living being</i>? why is this significant? Vs. 7 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> What did <i>God seriously command the man</i>? Vs. 8 – 9, 15 – 17 What does God mean by, “<i>when you eat of it you will surely die!</i>”? Vs.17b What <i>authority did God grant the man</i>? What does this <i>tell you about God himself</i>? Vs. 15, 19 – 20a How and why did <i>God create the woman</i>? Vs. 18, 20b – 25 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> According to God’s creation account, what is the <i>definition of a family</i>? What can <i>Christians do/how should we live to better advocate God’s definition of a family</i>?
Tuesday (Apr.15 th)	<p>Scripture: Genesis 3:1 – 7</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Carefully <i>read the conversation between the serpent and the woman</i>. How did the <i>serpent deceive the woman</i> and how did <i>she react</i>? Vs. 1 – 5 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> What does this <i>teach and remind you about temptation/schemes of Satan</i>? What are the <i>three aspects of temptation</i>? How should we <i>avoid them</i>? Vs. 6 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> What did the man and the woman do once “<i>they realized they were naked</i>”? What does their <i>action signify</i>? Now that you are a Christian, how is your <i>handling of temptation and sin differ from before</i> or is it still the same (dangerous)?
Wednesday (Apr.16 th)	<p>Scripture: Genesis 3:8 – 24</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> What did the man and his wife do <i>when they heard God’s return</i>? Vs. 8 – 10 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Why do you think God asked Adam, “<i>Where are you?</i>”? Vs. 9 What do you think is <i>wrong with the man and his wife’s responses when God confronted them</i> of their disobedience? Vs. 11 – 13 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> How <i>is life in the garden now different</i> from before The Fall? Vs. 14 – 19 What <i>characteristic of God</i> can you find when he “<i>made garments of skin for Adam and his wife and clothed them</i>”? Vs. 21 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> How do you think the <i>LORD God felt</i> when he had to discipline and banish the man and his wife from the Garden of Eden? Vs. 22 – 24
Thursday (Apr.17 th)	<p>Scripture: Genesis 4:1 – 16</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Why do you think God <i>favoured Abel’s offering³ more than Cain</i>? Vs. 3 – 5 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Why do you think God asked Cain, “<i>Why are you angry? Why is your face downcast? Where is your brother Abel? What have you done?</i>”? Vs. 6, 9, 10 What do you think is the <i>main reason that Cain murdered Abel</i> and how did he <i>react when God confronted him</i>? Vs. 7 – 14 What <i>characteristic of God</i> can you find from what he did to Cain before Cain’s departure from his presence? Vs. 15 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> What does this <i>first murder case tell you about the consequence of The Fall</i> (disobedience against God) and what <i>reflection does it give you</i>?

Friday (Apr.18 th)	<p>Scripture: Genesis 4:17 – 26</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> In Cain’s wandering state, why do you think he <i>starts a family and builds a city</i>? That is, what is the <i>significance for he is only a wanderer</i>? Vs. 17 – 18 How is the <i>definition of a family changed after The Fall</i>? Vs. 19 When <i>civilization advances, what happens to sin and violence</i>? Vs. 23 – 24 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> What do you think happens to human life when “<i>one proclaimed his complete independence from God</i>”?⁴ Would you <i>consider yourself as someone who fully and completely dependent on God</i> in every aspect of your life? How so? What <i>similarities</i> do you see <i>in our world today</i> compared to Genesis time?
Saturday (Apr.19 th)	<p>Scripture: Genesis 5:1 – 32</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> what do you think is the <i>difference between God created man in his own perfect image before and after The Fall</i>? Vs. 1 – 3 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Though we are all sinners, how do you <i>feel knowing that we are all originally created in the image and likeness of God</i>? What <i>similarities</i> can you find from all the <i>individuals from verses 3 – 32</i> What is <i>unique about Enoch’s description</i> compared to the others? Vs. 21 – 24 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> What do you think <i>life would like</i> for someone who <i>walks with God</i> versus someone who <i>walks without God</i>? As a Christian, <i>do you truly “walk with God” on a daily basis</i>? How so?
Sunday (Apr.20 th)	<p>Scripture: Psalms 47</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> How did the <i>Psalmist invite the nations to rejoice in the God of Israel</i>? Vs. 1 – 6 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> What did the <i>Lord over all the earth do that is worthy of rejoice</i>? Vs. 2 – 3 What has <i>God done in your life lately</i> that is worthy of praise? How is God’s enthronement being described? Vs. 7 – 9 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> As you face and live each day’s issues in the world, what encouragement does it give you to know that “<i>For God is the King of all the earth; God reigns over the nations</i>”? Vs. 7 If you are invited to <i>write a psalm of praise/rejoice to the LORD God</i>. What would you write? Try to write one for yourself.
