

Monday (Apr. 21 st)	<p><u>Scripture: Genesis 6:1-8</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What do we learn here concerning (a) the fallen condition of human nature, and (b) God's attitude to sin? 2. What does God want his children to place greater value in when looking for a marriage partner? 3. Note: In Gen. 6:3 the words 'a hundred and twenty years' probably refer not to the average length of human life, but to the respite for repentance which the human race was to have from that time to the Flood. What do you learn about God's character by giving the evil human race so much time to change?
Tuesday (Apr. 22 nd)	<p><u>Scripture: Genesis 6:9-22</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What do we learn here concerning the provision of a way of salvation? 2. 'Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord.' What were his characteristics? Look up Hebrews 11:7 also.
Wednesday (Apr. 23 rd)	<p><u>Scripture: Genesis 7:1-24</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What was God's part in Noah's salvation, and what was Noah's? (See also Eph. 2:8; Phil. 2:12, 13; 1 Peter 1:5) 2. In the ark Noah was not saved from being affected by the Flood at all, but he was brought safely through (1 Peter 3:20). In what similar way does the gospel of Christ offer us salvation from God's judgment upon sin?
Thursday (Apr. 24 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Genesis 8:1-22</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What did Noah's altar and burnt offerings signify? To what would they correspond in our lives today? See Romans 12:1; Hebrews 13:15, 16. 2. Reflect on Noah's position after the Flood. In what ways did God encourage him?
Friday (Apr. 25 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Genesis 9:1-17</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What makes human life supremely precious? What kind of penalty is here ordained for the murderer? Note that even an animal is accountable to God for taking a human life.

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 2. What may we learn here concerning the place and manner of covenant making? What other visible signs you can think of which seal covenants?
Saturday (Apr. 26 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Genesis 9:18-29</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Although the human race was saved through the Flood, it remains fallen. What are the two different responses to human sin and disobedience: the way of Ham or the way of Shem and Japheth? Which is the proper response? 2. Note that Ham passed his sinful ways onto Canaan and then to the Canaanites. How does one stop the curse of sin from passing on to their children? 3. How do you respond to others' sin? How do you respond when you sin?
Sunday (Apr. 27 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Psalm 48</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What is the down-fall of an evil, proud, and powerful tyrant? See 2 Kings 18 and 19 for the inspiration to this Psalm. 2. What should be the response of God's people to such a display of God's power and love? 3. When was the last time God had helped you won a battle in your life that you know you cannot win on your own?
