

Monday (Apr. 28 <sup>th</sup> )	<p><b><u>Scripture: Genesis 10:1-32</u></b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. What does Genesis 10 teach about the origins of nations?</li> <li>2. What is their relation to one another?</li> <li>3. What is their relation to God? See Acts 17:26-28; Romans 3:29.</li> </ol>
Tuesday (Apr. 29 <sup>th</sup> )	<p><b><u>Scripture: Genesis 11:1-9</u></b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. What was wrong with the attitude and activity of these men?</li> <li>2. What kind of judgment does God bring on those who seek supposed success in their way rather than in His way? See Psalm 2:1-4; Luke 11:23; Genesis 3:22-24; Isaiah 14:12-15; contrast John 11:49-52, especially verse 52.</li> </ol>
Wednesday (Apr. 30 <sup>th</sup> )	<p><b><u>Scripture: Genesis 11:10-26</u></b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. How is the faithfulness of God being revealed in the life of Shem and his sons and their sons?</li> <li>2. In what ways is Shem and his sons fulfilling the ‘Creation Mandate’ of ‘Be fruitful and increase in number; multiply on the earth and increase upon it’ (Gen. 9:7, 1:28)?</li> <li>3. Why was Shem important for Abram?</li> </ol>
Thursday (May 1 <sup>st</sup> )	<p><b><u>Scripture: Genesis 11:27-12:9</u></b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The writer discloses the fact that Sarai was barren—why was this fact a threat to the covenant God had made with Noah and his sons?</li> <li>2. Consider the inseparable intermingling of command and promise in God’s call to Abram. How, in consequence, did Abram’s faith express itself? See Hebrews 11:8</li> <li>3. Where was Terah’s final destination (Gen. 11:31)? Why did this destination become important to Abram?</li> <li>4. Compare and contrast Gen. 11:31 with 12:5. What was different about Abram’s journey as you compare it to Terah’s. In what ways is a similar response demanded by the gospel of Christ?</li> </ol>
Friday (May 2 <sup>nd</sup> )	<p><b><u>Scripture: Genesis 12:10-20</u></b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. In what two respects did Abram’s faith fall short under the tests of famine and fear? When he acted unworthily how was he rebuked?</li> </ol>

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>2. Can you think of a time where you comprised the truth in your life, what were the consequences?</li> <li>3. In what way did Abram get off easy with his lies?</li> </ol>
Saturday (May 3 <sup>rd</sup> )	<p><b><u>Scripture: Genesis 13:1-18</u></b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. What may we learn from Genesis 13:3,4? See Revelation 2:5. When you are wandering aimlessly, what should you do?</li> <li>2. Put yourself in Lot’s place when Abram’s offer was made to him. What was the motive that decided his choice, and how did it end?</li> <li>3. What did Abram lose by letting Lot choose first? See Matthew 16:25.</li> </ol>
Sunday (May 4 <sup>th</sup> )	<p><b><u>Scripture: Psalm 49</u></b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. How do men in general regard wealth? See verses 6, 13, 18. But what are the facts? What can wealth not do (verses 7-9)? What is the end of a rich man (verses 10-14, 17-20)?</li> <li>2. Why is it better to trust in God than in riches? See verses 14, 15. What is the psalmist’s counsel to himself and to us? See verses 5 and 16.</li> </ol>

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
