

Monday (May 19 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Genesis 23:1-20</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What features in Abraham's character does the story of this chapter bring out? What may we learn from his example concerning the right way to face both life and death?
Tuesday (May 20 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Genesis 24:1-67</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What can we learn from the attitude of Abraham's servant in his relation to (a) his master, and (b) the task given to him? What were his confidence and concern? 2. Examine the manner in which the servant made his choice, and the test he employed. Can we learn from this about choosing a life-partner?
Wednesday (May 21 st)	<p><u>Scripture: Genesis 25:1-11</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Besides, Isaac and Ishmael, how many other sons did Abraham have? What lesson can we learn about God's promise? 2. What kind of man was Isaac?
Thursday (May 22 nd)	<p><u>Scripture: Genesis 25:12-18</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. From verse 12 is the account of Ishmael. Seemingly, Ishmael's existence was harmful (18), but it showed God's promise to Abraham was fulfilled. Ishmael had borne 12 tribal leaders, which would make a great nation. What was the problem among Ishmael's descendants?
Friday (May 23 rd)	<p><u>Scripture: Genesis 25:19-26</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Isaac was the covenant son of God. So, he prayed to the LORD on behalf of Rebekah for 20 years. What spiritual lesson does this intercession show you? 2. From the time they were in their mother's womb, Isaac's sons, Esau and Jacob, were rivals. What were the main reasons for this rivalry?
Saturday (May 24 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Genesis 25:27-34</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Contrast Jacob and Esau as described in 25:27-34, in their habits, character, and spiritual outlook. 2. Esau despised his birthright and put little value on it. He had no interest in the things of God. He was only interested in satisfying

	<p>his present and physical needs. So he was not fit to receive a blessing from God. He was not fit to be the leader of the family, either.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. What is our birthright today? It can be our spiritual titles or positions or calling from God. We should be cautious not to sell our birthright for the physical needs or worldly pleasures.
Sunday (May 25 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Psalm 52</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How is the godless man described? In what does he put his trust, and what is his end? 2. In what does the godly man trust, and what is the result for him?
