

Monday (June 30 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Exodus 1:15-22</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Contrast the midwives' courage and fear of the Lord, to the Pharaoh's powerful, yet paranoid demeanor. 2. It is ironic that Pharaoh thought that men were the threat. Meanwhile, the midwives continued to conquer their fear of the Pharaoh because they feared God (v. 17, 21) more. How did these two women outmaneuver the Pharaoh? Why was God please with these two women? How will you conduct your life when the world is forcing you to act against the standards of God?
Tuesday (July 1 st)	<p><u>Scripture: Exodus 2:1-10</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Evaluate the narratives of Exodus 2 and Matthew 2. What are the similarities found in these 'salvation' stories? 2. What were the circumstances that afforded Moses the preparation for his life work? What does this reveal concerning God's way of working?
Wednesday (July 2 nd)	<p><u>Scripture: Exodus 2:11-25</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Three times in these verses Moses intercedes on behalf of weak people who have been wronged. Nevertheless, these three short scenes also reveal what was lacking in Moses' character and education. 2. Moses needed authority from God and exercising God's law in the wilderness. What areas in your own life do you need authority from God and what areas of your life would you consider your "wilderness"?
Thursday (July 3 rd)	<p><u>Scripture: Exodus 3:1-12</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Consider God's revelation of Himself in the incident of the burning bush. How would you sum up God's being and character as revealed in Chapter 3?
Friday (July 4 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Exodus 3:13-22</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Remembering God's name means remembering the mighty acts of salvation and deliverance God has performed (ref. Ps.111:2-9). Recall your own personal salvation and deliverance. 2. Verse 20 is the first mention of the wonders that the "hand" of God would perform. What was it?

Saturday (July 5 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Exodus 4:1-9</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Was Moses' reluctance to accept God's call to be commended? (ref. 2 Cor.3:5; Rom. 12:3) Why was God angry with him? 2. The use of the staff, the skin disease, and the blood were primers for Moses, demonstrating the thin line between visible miraculous signs that stimulate belief (as with the Israelites) and miraculous signs that hardened hearts, as the plagues would.
Sunday (July 6 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Psalm 58</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. When earthly rulers pervert justice and 'deal out violence', what can the righteous do? What will prove to them that 'there is a God who judges on earth'? Notice the vivid imageries of verses 6-9.
