

Monday (Sept 1 st)	<p><u>Scripture: Exodus 28:1-38</u></p> <p>1. For the order in which the priest's garments were put on, see Lev. 8:7-9. Each has some significance: the coat of pure linen (v. 39) indicating the high priest as a righteous man; the blue robe (vv.31-35) as a heavenly man; the ephod [a shoulder garment, covering breast & back] with the names of the tribes (vv.3-29) as a representative man; the mitre with its golden plate (vv.336-38) as a holy man. Reflect how in all these ways the high priest of Israel in His priestly garments was a type of Christ.</p>
Tuesday (Sept 2 nd)	<p><u>Scripture: Exodus 29:1-34</u></p> <p>1. In this instruction concerning the consecration of the priests, distinguish the various parts of the ceremony: the cleansing, the robbing, the anointing, and the sacrifices. How does our High Priest stand out in contrast to Aaron? (ref. Heb. 7:26-28)</p>
Wednesday (Sept 3 rd)	<p><u>Scripture: Exodus 29:35-46</u></p> <p>1. What is the significance of the daily burnt offering morning and evening? What are the counterparts to these activities which are possible for us to share in?</p>
Thursday (Sept 4 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Exodus 30:1-22</u></p> <p>1. Exodus 30 includes instruction essential to priestly service in the tabernacle: making the gold incense altar for the tent of meeting (v. 1-10); collecting the tabernacle census tax (vv.11-16); making the bronze basin for the courtyard (vv.17-21); the anointing oil ingredients (vv.18-33); & the incense recipe (vv.34-38).</p>
Friday (Sept 5 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Exodus 30:22-38</u></p> <p>1. The altar of incense and the bronze layer speak of the need for prayer and for daily cleansing (ref. Ps. 141:2; Jn. 13:10; 1Jn 1:8-9). What lessons can we learn from this chapter on these important subjects?</p>
Saturday (Sept 6 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Exodus 31:1-18</u></p> <p>1. What was God's part & what was man's in the designing and making of the Tabernacle? See verses 1-11, cross-reference with 25:2.</p>

Sunday (Sept 7 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Psalm 66</u></p> <p>1. Psalm 66 is the summons to the nations to join in praise to God for a great deliverance which He has fashioned for His people. Note in detail what God is said to do with & for His people. What response should this Psalm move you to make?</p>
