

Monday (Sept 22 nd)	<p><u>Scripture: Exodus 39:1-43</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Try to picture the Tabernacle and furniture as described here. What New Testament truths does it foreshadow? (ref. Heb.9:8-12)
Tuesday (Sept 23 rd)	<p><u>Scripture: Exodus 40:1-16</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. "...just as the Lord commanded him." Occurs repeatedly in this passage concerning the making of the Tabernacle. What does this teach us about our own service for God? (ref. Jn. 15:14)
Wednesday (Sept 24 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Exodus 40:17-38</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. By building the Tabernacle, it represents the reconciliation between people and the Lord. There was a building of hope. These chapters tell the truth about the dependence of love and reconciliation on mutual labor and attention to detail. The Lord met the excellent work of the people with approval, "moving into" their camp to "tabernacle" in their midst. How can we then apply these past experiences into our present ministries?
Thursday (Sept 25 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Joshua 1:1-9</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. List the promises God made to Joshua (ref. Dt.31:7-8). What conditions of success was he given? What picture of Joshua is given in this chapter?
Friday (Sept 26 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Joshua 1:10-18</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What principles, warnings, or encouragement to be found in these verses can be applied to your own life?
Saturday (Sept 27 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Joshua 2:1-24</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How does the story in this chapter justify the statement in Heb. 11:31? Compare Rahab's words with the actual position of the Israelites at the time, and note verse 11 especially. 2. Observe how Rahab's faith kindled the faith of the spies. What stimulus does this give us in the life of faith? What parallel is suggested to you by the house protected by the scarlet thread with verse 19? (ref. Ex. 12:22)

Sunday (Sept 28 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Psalm 68:19-35</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How is the blessedness of God's people described in verses 19-27? In your own experience, do you know God as He is here set forth? What could we learn from these verses concerning the character and place of public worship? 2. What vision does the psalmist see of a world-wide homage paid to God, and how is this confirmed by other Scriptures?
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
