

Monday (Oct 13 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Joshua 9:16-27</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What did the Israelites do when they realized they had been tricked by the Gibeonites? How did that affect those responsible for those responsible for the unpopular treaty? 2. How did Joshua finally deal with the Gibeonites? What was their response to Joshua's curse? 3. Strategy was important for Joshua. What does that say about the use of strategy in planning your life? In doing God's work?
Tuesday (Oct 14 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Joshua 10:1-14</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Who are the people that attack Gibeon? Why do they do so? 2. How do Joshua and the Israelites get involved? If you were Joshua, would you have helped the Gibeonites after their trickery in Chapter 9? 3. Who is a person in your life that you would call during a tough time? 4. What are you doing now that you wish God would give you more time to accomplish?
Wednesday (Oct 15 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Joshua 10:15-27</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What was the meaning of Joshua's instructions on verse 24? What might be the comparable action today? 2. How did Joshua encourage his troops in word and in deed?
Thursday (Oct 16 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Joshua 10:28-43</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What major cities did the Israelites attack? What was the outcome of each attack? 2. Do you notice a pattern in how each victory is reported? 3. According to verses 40-42, how much of the promised land had been conquered up to this point? 4. Where in your life is it evident that the Lord is fighting for you? Do you have anyone alongside you in that battle?
Friday (Oct 17 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Joshua 11:1-15</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Why might Joshua have been afraid of this army even after his many victories? 2. At what points can you identify with Joshua: (a) When all his enemies are coming to attack him? (b) When he is

	<p>winning, but the war is lasting a long time? (c) When the land finally had rest from war?</p>
Saturday (Oct 18 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Joshua 11:16-23</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Verses 16-20 describe the conquest of the north. What geography lesson do you see here? 2. Why did his campaign take a long time? What was left after it was finished? 3. Do you always expect success when you are obedient to God? Why or why not?
Sunday (Oct 19 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Psalm 71</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Observe these three movements of prayer: (a) faith, praying, rises to hope and praise (verses 1-8); (b) faith, under a renewed sense of urgent need, falls back into prayer, and again rises to hope and praise (verses 9-16); (c) faith, for the third time driven to prayer, rises quickly to assurance, praise and witness, and there abides (verses 20-24). What does this teach us about praying continually?
