

Monday (Oct 20 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Joshua 12:1-24</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Why do you think so many cities are listed in this chapter? What was the importance of such a list to the people of Israel in later generations? 2. Has God helped you conquer any of the following in your life: Bad temper? Shyness? Certain phobia? Smoking? Serious illness? Bad marriage? Weight problem? Poor self-image? 3. Who has led the way for your own spiritual growth in the past year?
Tuesday (Oct 21 st)	<p><u>Scripture: Joshua 13:1-12</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. As Joshua approaches retirement, what does the Lord tell him? How do you think Joshua felt about that? 2. What could you once do, but not anymore, due to “advancing years”?
Wednesday (Oct 22 nd)	<p><u>Scripture: Joshua 13:13-33</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What is noteworthy about the slaying of Balaam (verse 22)? Why did he deserve that (ref. Nu. 25; 31:8)? Would they feel slighted or doubly blessed by this assignment?
Thursday (Oct 23 rd)	<p><u>Scripture: Joshua 14:1-15</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How did the nine and a half tribes west of the Jordan receive their land? 2. Why treat the two and a half tribes and the Levites differently? 3. “Actions reveal character.” If so, what do Caleb’s actions say about the kind of man he was in the prime of life (verses 6-9)? How was he different from the others sent by Moses to explore the land? 4. Has Caleb changed since then (verses 10-12)? Why or why not? 5. What was the area that Caleb wanted for himself? What does his request show you about his confidence in God? Your own faith in God? 6. What would it mean for you to serve God wholeheartedly in the coming year?
Friday (Oct 24 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Joshua 15:1-12</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Consult a Bible map for this period to help answer these questions. The first allotment of land west of the Jordan

	land? Where was it in relation to the rest of the Promised Land?
Saturday (Oct 25 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Joshua 15:13-19</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What do we learn about Caleb in verses 13-19? What does he do with the portion of land allotted to him? How was he able to get the best out of others?
Sunday (Oct 26 th)	<p><u>Scripture: Psalm 72</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What are the two outstanding personal characteristics of Christ as King, as seen in this psalm? See verses 1, 2, and 12-14 (ref. Ps. 116:5). What does the psalm say will be (a) the results of His rule (verses 3-7, 12-14, 16, 17), and (b) the extent of His rule (verses 8-11)? 2. Does this psalm give a perfect picture of that happy earth which men are vainly trying to bring into being by their own wisdom and work? According to Scripture, who alone can make this happen, and to whom should men look for its accomplishment? See verses 1, 17-19 (ref. Act :12; Eph. 1:3).
